NOTICE OF 2012 ELECTIONS

ELECTIONS WILL BE HELD IN SASKATOON ON WEDNESDAY, OCTOBER 24, 2012.

Eligible voters will vote on the following:

SASKATOON CITY COUNCIL

- Mayor – to be elected at large
- Ten City Councillors – one to be elected in each of the ten Wards

SASKATOON PUBLIC SCHOOL DIVISION NO. 13

- Ten Trustees – one to be elected in each of the ten Wards

ST. PAUL'S ROMAN CATHOLIC SEPARATE SCHOOL DIVISION NO. 20

- Seven Trustees – to be elected at large

The hours of voting on Election Day are: 8:00A.M. to 8:00P.M.

GENERAL INFORMATION

WHO CAN VOTE

Mayor and Councillors

To vote, you must:

- 1) Be a Canadian citizen on the day of the election;
- 2) Be 18 years of age on the day of the election;
- 3) On the day of the election, have resided for at least three consecutive months immediately preceding the day of the election in the municipality, or own assessable land situated in the municipality; and
- 4) On the day of the election, have resided in the Province of Saskatchewan for at least six consecutive months immediately preceding the day of the election.

Public School Board Trustees

To vote, you must:

- 1) Be a Canadian citizen on the day of the election;
- 2) Be 18 years of age on the day of the election;
- 3) On the day of the election, have resided in the school division for at least three consecutive months immediately preceding the day of the election;
- 4) On the day of the election, have resided in the Province of Saskatchewan for at least six consecutive months immediately preceding the day of the election.

Separate School Board (Catholic) Trustees

In addition to meeting the requirements noted for the Public School Board Trustees, you must:

- 5) Be of the religious faith of the minority that established the separate school division. **(For Saskatoon, that means Catholic.)**

You must also provide proof of your identity and your residence prior to voting.

GENERAL VOTING RULES

NEW!!! VOTER IDENTIFICATION

Before you vote, you are required to provide proof of your identity and your residence, and to sign a declaration that states you are eligible to vote. There are many ways to prove your identity and your residence.

Option I:

- One original piece of identification that includes your photo, name and address.
- The identification must be issued by a federal, provincial, or municipal government, such as a valid Saskatchewan Driver's License.

If your identification does not meet these criteria it will not be recognized as an acceptable form of identification.

If you do not have a driver's license, you may obtain photo identification from Saskatchewan Government Insurance at little or no cost.

Option II:

- Two original pieces of information, both of which must contain your name and at least one that contains your address. Examples of acceptable identification options include a utility bill issued to you within the last six months, and a credit card statement.

Option III:

If you do not possess any form of acceptable identification you may have another voter vouch for you. In this case, the following requirements must be met:

- You must be accompanied by another voter who has acceptable identification; and
- The voter who is vouching for you must be entitled to vote at the same polling place.

Residency

- For the purpose of these elections, the residence of a person is the place where that person ordinarily resides.
- A person who is temporarily absent from the place where that person ordinarily resides does not lose his or her residence.
- No one can have more than one residence in the province – if a person has more than one home in the province, he or she must choose one of them as his or her residence.
- A voter may vote only once during an election. However, a person who qualifies as an elector in a resort village and as an elector of another municipality may vote at both elections. Similarly, a qualified elector may vote both at an election of the municipality in which that person resides and a municipality in which that person is the owner of assessable land.



WHERE TO VOTE

Not sure where to vote on Election Day?

Here's how to find out:

- Refer to the ward maps on pages 4–8 to find the ward and poll in which you reside, and the location of your polling place. Poll boundaries run down the centre of the street or lane. If you live on the boundary, you will vote at the polling place on the **same side** of the boundary as where you live.

Or

- Visit www.saskatoon.ca/go/vote and use the online form to find your polling place. You will be asked to enter your home address, and from there you will be provided with your Ward number and the location and address of your polling place.

Or

Call the City Clerk's Office at 975-3240.

Polling Station Information

- You may vote only at the Polling Station for the poll in which you reside on Election Day. If you go to a polling station other than that one, you will be directed to the proper one.
- Before you vote, you will be asked to provide proof of your identity and your residence and complete a Voter's Registration Form.
- Polling Stations will be open from 8:00 a.m. to 8:00 p.m. on Election Day, Wednesday, October 24, 2012.

NEW!!! VOTE BY MAIL

IF YOU WILL BE AWAY FROM THE CITY ON ELECTION DAY AND THE ADVANCE POLL DAYS, YOU CAN VOTE BY MAIL

- Eligible voters may apply to vote using a mail-in ballot. To vote by mail, you must apply in person at City Hall, City Clerk's Office, 222 – 3rd Avenue North.
- When you apply, you will be asked to complete a Voter's Registration Form and to prove your identity and residence by providing acceptable identification.
- In early October, you will receive a ballot package in the mail at your temporary address. It will contain a ballot, instructions on how to complete and return the ballot, and a postage-paid return envelope.
- Your ballot must be received by the Returning Officer by 8:00 p.m. on October 24, 2012.



VOTING ASSISTANCE

THERE ARE SEVERAL OPTIONS IF YOU NEED ASSISTANCE TO VOTE.

Polling Station Support

- Election officials at each Polling Station are available to provide assistance to voters who have a physical disability, or who have difficulty reading or writing.
- Voters may also bring a relative or friend with them to the Polling Station. After they sign a declaration, they may help you vote in any way you require.
- Magnifying devices and a ballot template are available at the Polling Stations upon request.

AutoMARK Voter Assist Terminal (VAT)

The AutoMARK Voter Assist Terminal (VAT) is an optical scan ballot marking terminal that provides privacy and accessibility to voters who are visually impaired or have physical impairments. The VAT allows voters with disabilities and other special needs to mark their ballot privately and independently. It combines a touch screen terminal and the same paper ballots that are used by all voters. The VAT also has a sip/puff tube and rocker paddle/foot switch that may be used by voters with limited motor function, or who are unable to use the touch screen or touch pad.

The VAT will be available for use at all voting locations during the Advance Polls.

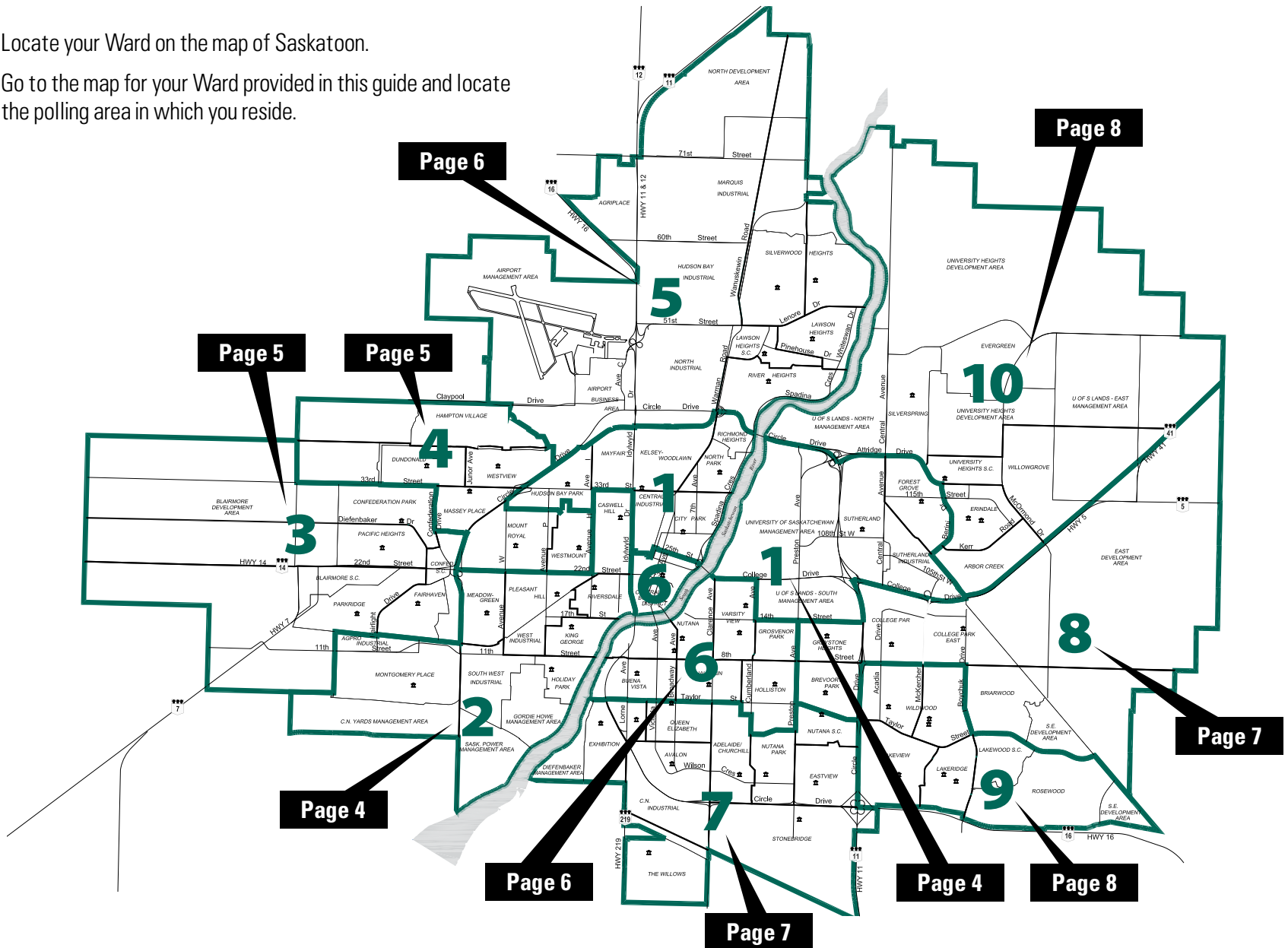
